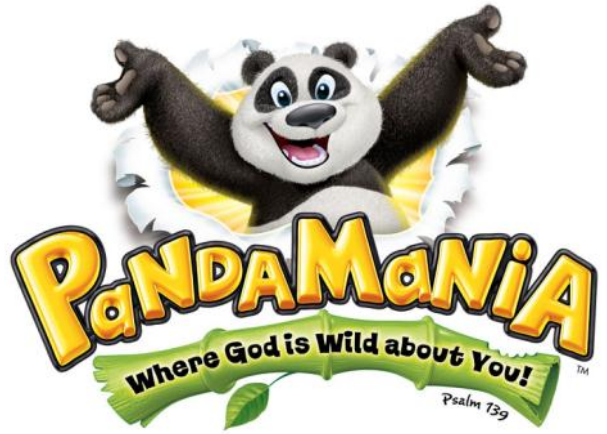

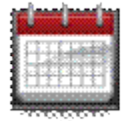

AUGUST EXTRA-STEP GIVING

On July 8th, Emmaus will celebrate its 118th birthday with a Founders Day Celebration. For those new to St. Paul's and the UCC, Emmaus was founded by members of the Evangelical Synod of North America in 1893 (on the former campus of the Marthasville Seminary (which was founded in 1850).

Throughout its history, many former and current members have spent their careers working to serve the folks that call Emmaus home. The church has also partnered (financially and with volunteering) to provide residential services and supports to several thousand persons with developmental disabilities. Residents usually come to Emmaus to live when they no longer have family or for many reasons the family can no longer care for them. Today, Emmaus serves over 240 adults on two campus' (one at Marthasville, and another in St. Charles) as well as in group homes and apartments in the communities throughout St. Charles, St. Louis and St. Charles counties. Most all of the residents receive 24 hour supports with their various needs. Many require assistance with bathing, toileting, meals, etc. while others may only need help with decision making and balancing their checkbooks. The average age is about 58.

For many, Emmaus and the church is their FAMILY. With your help, Emmaus will continue to be able to provide loving and compassionate care. Thank you to all at St. Paul's for all you do to make this ministry possible.
