Multi-Generational Church GROWS!!

We "talk" a lot about wanting to be a church that is for all generations - the young and the old as well as the new-to-the-area and the long-timers. We even print in our weekly bulletin: *Because we honor & respect worshippers of all ages, we sing a variety of songs/hymns & incorporate a mixture of musical styles & instruments. May such an approach honor God & His people, today!*

Are we alone as a church who seeks to do such? Not at all. Many churches "talk the talk" - we want to grow, we want to reach new people, we want to see young families in our church, etc. - but few "walk the walk"!

Congratulations, St. Paul's Church - YOU DO BOTH! For instance, on November 7th we welcomed 14 new members to St. Paul's Church (see separate article for "bios" of each family). Did you notice the generational representation among the new members? Two teenagers, two in their 20's, two in their 30's, two in their 40's, three in their 50's, two in their 60's, one in the 80's! **THAT'S MULTIGENERATIONAL!** Yeah, God!!

Why did they join St. Paul's? Better yet, why did they come back after visiting the first time? Because of you, St. Paul's Church! **(Yes, I'm blaming YOU...it's your fault we are growing as a Church).** Granted, these new members expressed appreciation for the worship service, the variety of music and the children's ministry; but, **the overwhelming majority commented on the friendly welcome they received from YOU, St. Paul's Church!** (NOTE: it wasn't even the sanctuary that drew people into membership - eight (8) of the new members had never even worshipped in our sanctuary, only worshipping in the fellowship hall).

What a reminder. When it comes to "being the church", it's about people! **Relationships not only matter to God, but to you, me and others the Lord draws to St. Paul's Church.** As we move toward Christmas, the season in which we celebrate God's being "relational" - God's taking on human form and coming to be with us (incarnation) - such emphasis on "relationships" is crucial.

Let's continue to be a Multi-Generational church - caring for people of all ages in all stages and phases of life!

December Extra Step Mission: Veterans of the Cross (now known as "The Christmas Fund.")

This fund is for retired pastors and their wives who are in need. Years ago, pensions and retirement funds were not available or well known, pastors lived in church property and never gained any equity in their homes. When a pastor retired, they retired without a home, nor means to supplement their social security incomes.

By donating to this Extra Step in December, your money will help provide resources for the Emergency Fund, which provides resources to these pastors. Gifts to this fund also help provide pension and health premium supplementation to low-income retirees (Medicare usually pays 80% of bills, and the supplementation insurance helps pay the remaining 20%).

Start Time: The event kicks off Friday evening at 8:00 PM, however couples are welcome to arrive any time after 5:00 PM. If all couples are able to arrive earlier than 8:00 PM we may begin our first session early.

Meals: A light breakfast on Saturday morning and a brunch on Sunday morning will be provided. Couples are encouraged to bring some snacks to share for the weekend. Each couple will be responsible for their own lunch and dinner on Saturday. Saturday evening couples will make plans to go out on a “Date”, a list of local restaurants will be provided. Room Assignments: The first 5 couples to register and turn in payment will get a lake-view room with 1 King or Queen size bed. The remaining 2 couples to register will get a room that has 2 twin beds, we will provide a queen size air mattress for those rooms. Each room will have access to a private bathroom.

Departure Time: Around Noon on Sunday. Out of courtesy to the Kazmaier's for hosting this event, couples are asked to wash their sheets and towels before they leave. Washers and dryers are available on each floor.

What to Expect: Throughout the weekend there will be 6 – one hour videos you will watch as a group (2 on Friday and 4 on Saturday). There will also be 3 couple projects you will be asked to complete throughout the weekend. The projects will be done privately with your spouse. To make the most of this experience couples are encouraged to do the projects. There will not be formal group discussions. This event is designed to be an intimate retreat with your spouse, how much you share with the other couples who are attending is entirely up to you.

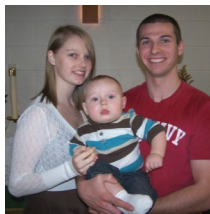

Food Pantry Moves to Charrette: Thanks St. Paul's for Years of Hospitality!

Following surveys of those the Southern Warren County Food Pantry serves, the move was made to continue serving from Charrette Baptist Church (until the April lightning strike and fire, the food pantry was housed in the basement of St. Paul's Church). A big reason for the move is the issue of accessibility. Nearly 2/3 of those served by the pantry have difficulty with steps.

Does this mean we no longer have anything to do with serving the community via the food pantry? Not at all. **In January the Missions Committee will initiate a "Bring-A-Meal" Sunday for St. Paul's Church.** What is this? For our Bring-A-Meal Sunday, the entire congregation is invited to bring the contents of a meal (non-perishable items) in a bag and place it in boxes near each entrance. Following worship on each first Sunday, Youth will participate in a "Service Sunday" by taking the food items to the Food Pantry at Charrette Baptist Church (and then serving the community in an additional way afterwards).

You don't have to wait 'til January, though. Bring-A-Meal any time of the month and set it to the left inside the entrance to the Narthex or the Lobby.

Family Faith Night has ADVENT & CHRISTMAS focus!

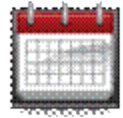
