## Cross Training Leads to Confirmation

On April 17, eight of our 12-14 year old youth will highlight the conclusion of a part of their journey of faith that we call confirmation-**that rite of passage whereby our young people go through a period of study concerning their baptismal vows and what following Jesus is all about.** As many of you discovered long ago, confirmation is not the end of the road for these young people, but one of many stops along their spiritual journey through life.

It's always my hope and prayer that confirmands come away with the tools to continue their discipleship journey into the deeper depths and the higher heights of the Christian faith. **Please continue to pray for these young people as they wrap up all their work, prepare and deliver their final presentations.** During Sunday Worship through April 10, confirmands each week will share a presentation articulating the essence of the Christian faith as if they were sharing it across a dining room table.

On the 17<sup>th</sup> of April, those who have completed their work will be confirmed. On Confirmation Day, each young person will be invited forward (along with parents, god-parents & confirmation leaders) for a special service of "laying on of hands" & a personal commendation. Then, on Thursday, April 21 at 7pm, confirmands will help in serving Holy Communion and receive their first communion.

Please join with parents and confirmation leaders (Chris Marquart, Larry & Darlene Brewes, and myself) in **encouraging these young disciples.**

## New Beginnings!

I have a friend, Pastor Joe Sullivan, that joined with a group of Christians in the Eureka - Pacific - Gray Summit areas over a decade ago to plant a new church. They decided on the name, "New Beginnings", for their church. Why? Isn't that what the Easter Message, and Christianity in general, is all about?

On the 24<sup>th</sup> of April we will celebrate Easter and be reminded of the *new beginnings* God came to this earth to initiate. You make a mess of your life - turn to Jesus and experience a *new beginning*; have an argument with your spouse - turn to him/her, ask for forgiveness, experience a *new beginning*; say things to your parent(s) or child out of anger, hurting them - turn to them, say you're sorry and experience a *new beginning*!

The week before Easter, on Thursday and Friday, we will be meeting at 7pm in the sanctuary to recall the price Jesus was willing to pay to initiate this *new beginning*.

From the parade-like celebration of Palm Sunday, the week leading up to Easter is filled with great meaning and cause for significant reflection. Beginning with Maundy Thursday, we will explore Jesus' last days through what we now call The Last Supper. Good Friday will be a "Service of Darkness" centered around the Cross. As we recall Jesus' betrayal and the eventual passion and sacrifice of our Lord: recalling Jesus' last words, sensing His moments of unfathom-able anguish and visualizing the agony of the cross. Narrators will guide us through that last day interspersed with music and congregational singing. The service will end in darkness and allow worshippers some quiet time of prayer and reflection at the foot of the large wooden cross at the front of the sanctuary.

THEN the glorious celebration on Easter Sunday (Sunrise service in the cemetery at sunrise, approximately 6:30am; Sanctuary worship at 9 & 10:30am) when eternal hope arose with the dawning of that third day! The white of lilies, the triumphant music of an infinite victory and the reminder of all our great God has given to us!

NOTE: between 10 & 10:30am there will be an expanded connection time in fellowship hall - coffee, juices and pastries will be available while the youngsters hunt for Easter eggs. Share the joy of Easter by inviting a friend(s) to share in the special day!

**This Easter, let's all claim a New Beginning!**

On Wednesday, March 18, a group of us (Larry and I, Pastor George, Dennis & Billie Kramme, Temme Sides, Shannon Dothage) left for Texas to attend a C3 Global Creative Church Conference at Fellowship Church in Dallas. I want to report on my weekend experience.

This next weekend I will be going with the Cross Training students on a retreat to work on their Statement of Faith - professing their Faith; which is also good for us to do - well I have a Pledge of Faith to share.

As the two walked and chatted, kicking stones and twigs, Timmy's little friend noticed the same lady was following them as she seemed to do every day all week.

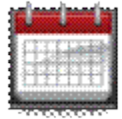
Finally she said to Timmy,
