St. Paul's to Participate in Back to Church Sunday

This fall there is a national movement encouraging churches to invite formerly churchd people to rediscover church and try it again. "[*Back To Church Sunday*](#)" is an initiative that seeks to reach the "un-churched" and "de-churched" people who once attended church, but don't any more – and invite them to return for a special Sunday.

According to LifeWay Research:

38 percent of people are receptive or highly receptive to attending church, and

82 percent say they would be open to attending church if a friend invited them, but unfortunately only 2 percent of active church-going Christians invited someone to church in the last year!

On November 13, we are joining with thousands of churches this fall to help change those statistics by inviting everyone to attend church. Who do you know that has drifted away from church? Who have you not seen in awhile at St. Paul's that you might extend a special invitation to worship on the 13th?

There is the traditional worship service at 9am or the 10:30am service which incorporates more contemporary elements. You are encouraged to invite that family member, neighbor, acquaintance, co-worker or friend to worship. Just imagine what God might do with your invitation!!

November Extra Step Mission: The Pregnancy Assistance Center

Pregnancy Assistance Center (PAC) is a ministry whose primary purpose is to save the lives of as many unborn babies as possible, while also assisting the families with their many other needs. It is located at 310 International Ave., Wash-ington, Mo. (636-239-1840). You are welcome to stop by when it's convenient.

Some of the services provided range from Pregnancy tests, helping arrange financial aid when needed, guiding client through a primary care physician and delivery doctor or clinic. The Center works with all delivery doctors in Washington, and also with Mercy Hospital's OB Clinic, pediatrician clinic and McAuley Clinic.

PAC also helps provide vitamins, much educational in-formation on child care, anger management, nutrition and many other things as needed. PAC works with "Love Basket" if adoption services are re-quired. The Center works with the client throughout the pregnancy and after the baby is born, helping to provide baby clothing, formula, baby food and other items such as cribs, safety seats, high chairs, etc. Birthing classes are taught by a Registered Nurse on a regular schedule.

Many families that receive assistance also receive food at Easter and Thanksgiving, as well as gifts for Christmas. During this last year the PAC has served over 4,000 persons. St Paul's has been a blessing in the past by helping to furnish needed gifts.

Beginning in early November through the middle of December there will be a Christmas Tree in the lobby with suggested items needed on the orna-ments. Everyone who would like to help make Christmas a special time for some family or child may take an ornament with them and bring that gift back some-time before December 12-15th. We will take them to the PAC to be wrapped and given to in-dividual families. You have helped to bright-en someone's life in a sometimes difficult situation.



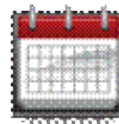
College Care Packs

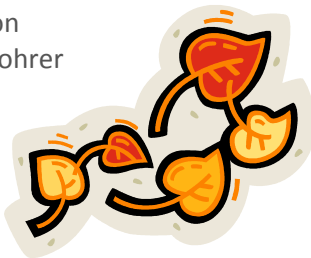
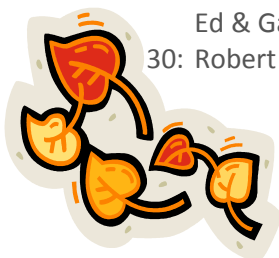

Did you know that nearly every week in worship the floral arrangement on the altar (the table that is front and center upon which the cross, bible, and candles are also placed) is placed there by persons in honor of, or in remembrance of, loved ones. It could be for a birth, graduation, anniversary, birthday, baptism, etc.

How does this work? On the lobby table there is a *Sign-Up Sheet/Calendar* labeled "Flowers for the Altar". List your information on the date in which you wish to place flowers. Four Seasons Florist creates an arrangement and one of St. Paul's Church's volunteers picks up the flowers and makes sure they are displayed on the altar each week. Four Seasons will bill you directly - the cost is typically in the area of \$11-18, depending on special requests, etc.
